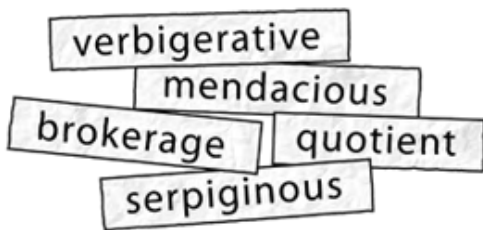




Human Rights Day Letter

Hard words

UDHR: Universal Declaration of Human Rights. A document signed by 192 countries, including the UK, saying they will protect human rights.

ECHR: European Convention of Human Rights. A law agreed by 46 countries, including the UK, saying what rights we have and that we can take the government to court if they do not look after them.

There is lots of work still to be done to protect human rights across the UK.
